Organics Drop-off Program

Pick up your free organics starter kit in the Public Works Lobby. The starter kit includes a collection bucket, a roll of bags and a flyer on organics. There is also a compostable bag dispenser right next to the organics bin at Community Park.



How Does the Program Work?

You collect your food waste and accepted materials in the collection bucket lined with a compostable bag. Tie the bag shut and bring the bag to the organics drop off bin.

What are Organics?

Organics are all food scraps, most non-recyclable and food-soiled paper, and BPI certified compostable products. This includes, but not limited to, dairy products, eggs and egg shells, breads, coffee grounds and filters, meat, fish, and bones. It also includes wooden items like popsicle sticks, chopsticks, and toothpicks, fruits, vegetables, peels, rinds, food and grease soiled pizza delivery boxes, paper egg cartons, paper towels, napkins and tissues. No yard waste is accepted.

Recycle Grants

The recycling program is mainly funded through grant funding including the SCORE (Select Committee on Recycling and the Environment) grant. St. Francis applies for grants through Anoka County to help fund the recycling program. That includes the recycling events, staffing at events, promotion and growing the program. For larger projects, Anoka County has a separate grant program. In 2023, the City applied for and received a \$20,000 grant to purchase an enclosed trailer for temporarily storing larger recyclable items and to promote recycling and organics at events. The trailer will be used to temporarily store larger recyclable items such as appliances and to help promote recycling at events.







This year, the City was awarded over \$22,000, to purchase new recycling stations in City parks. The City replaced the ones in Deer Creek 2nd and Seelye Brooke in 2022. The new stations will be placed in Hidden Ponds, Rum River, Durigan Locher and Highland Woods. These stations are clearly marked for trash and recycling, are made of recyclable material and are easier for the parks crew to maintain. The grant will also cover the cost of the concrete pads so they can be securely attached to the ground.


